TOWN MOVED TO ESCAPE FLOOD PERIL

NATCHEZ, Miss., Feb. 16—(ANP)—Pressing the work of moving the town of Vidalia, La., to its new site a half mile inland from the Mississippi river front, wreckers last Saturday had razed the ancient courthouse and jail buildings. The town's present population is about 600. Vidalia was established when Natchez was the seat of government under Spanish dominion, was named in honor of Don Jose Vidal. The project is partly PWA financed.

Negro Resettlement project in Louisiana's Madison and East Carroll parishes, has been awarded to E. E. Rabalais of Bunkie, La., one of that state's leading contractors. Each of the 147 units of the farmstead project will consist of a five-room house, a commodious barn, an up-to-date poultry house. The houses will vary somewhat in design so that monotony of appearance will be avoided, six different plans in all being used.

Each dwelling will have three bedrooms, a living room modern kitchen, screened back porch and a storage room that can be transferred into a kitchen when income of the family permits. When completed, the units, together with 40 acres of fertile land, will be occupied by Negro farm families. Total amount of the contract for the project is \$275,537. Farm Security Administration officials expect construction to begin at an early date.

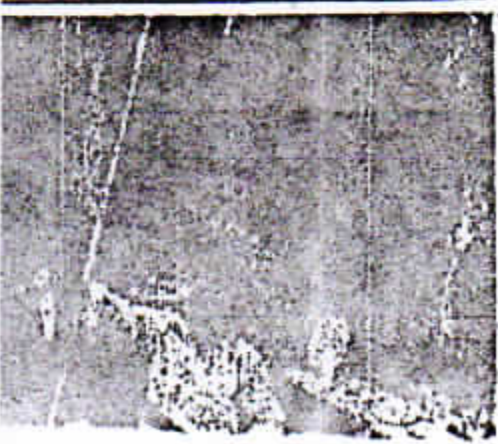
