This cause having come on for hearing on August 22, 1962 in open court, and it appearing from the pre-trial conference held immediately prior to the hearing, all attorneys of record being present and Cecil Manning being present, that Cecil Manning has been issued a commission by the State of Louisiana through the State Board of Registration, as Registrar of Voters of East Carroll Parish, and he having formally accepted same by the signing of the required oath of office, and as recited by the Court in the record, Cecil Manning has reassumed his duties as Registrar of Voters of East Carroll Parish and on request by the Court for the United States to move to dismiss the criminal contempt proceeding against Cecil Manning, and said motion having been made by the United States:

It is ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the criminal contempt proceedings against Cecil Manning be and the same are hereby dismissed.

It is further ORDERED that the civil contempt proceedings against Cecil Manning be and the same are hereby dismissed.

It is further ORDERED that Cecil E. Manning, Registrar of Voters, East Carroll Parish, Louisiana, shall open his office, to receive applications for registration, beginning on September 4, 1962, and thereafter shall keep his office open for such

purpose not less than three days each week; notice of the days and hours during which the office will be open shall be posted on the principal door to the Registrar's office, and shall further be published at least once in the official journal of East Carroll Parish, and thereafter as often as may be necessary to notice all changes in schedule.

This Court retains jurisdiction of this cause for such further orders and decrees as may be necessary.
